Colonel Henry Houghton

HOUGHTON — Colonel Henry, 81 years of age. Lost his battle against cancer at Whitechapel Nursing Home on Saturday 27 Feb. at 2:30 A.M.. Colonel Houghton was a veteran of the Civil War where he reached the rank of Captain in the 22nd Massachusetts Volunteer Regiment. He was promoted to Major in 1882 and served as Colonel in the 2nd Massachusetts Volunteer Regiment in the Spanish-American War, where he took part the 1898 Siege of Santiago. Latterly, Colonel Houghton served as a magistrate in Arkham County. Colonel Houghton was a widower, his wife having drowned in a yachting accident in 1887. His daughter, Abigail, died of typhoid fever in 1888, and his son, Albert, was sadly killed in 1902 following an accident in an experimental aircraft of his own design. Colonel Houghton is succeeded by his younger brother, Edward, and by his grand-niece, Rebecca. Private interment at Arlington Cemetery, Virginia.
